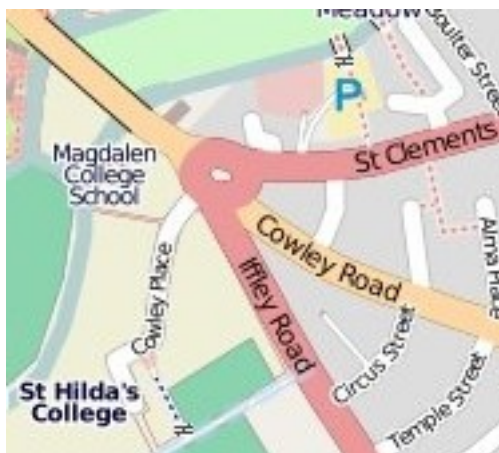
St Hilda's College and the JDP

The Jacqueline du Pré Music Building was the first purpose-built concert hall to be built in Oxford since the Holywell Music Room in Handel's day. It is a living memorial to a great artist and honorary fellow of St Hilda's.

The college was founded in 1893 by Dorothea Beale, Principal of Cheltenham Ladies' College. Miss Beale chose to honour St Hilda, the head of Whitby Abbey, as the double monastery was famous for its learning. Until 2007 St Hilda's was the last all-women's college of Oxford University.

St Hilda's has a superb literary tradition across all genres. PD James is an honorary fellow and Val McDermid is an alumna. Susanna Clarke graduated from the college in 1981 while TWF's Juliet McKenna took her degree in 1988. The Write Fantastic's connections with Cowley Place also include Chaz Brenchley, educated just across the road at Magdalen College School.

By Car

Use the Thornhill Park & Ride for St Hilda's College. Buses stop on St Clements, a few minutes' walk from the college.

The Oxford Bus Company No.5 service runs from the station to the Cowley Road every 5-10 minutes.
